10-9a-509 Applicant's entitlement to land use application approval -- Municipality's requirements and limitations -- Vesting upon submission of development plan and schedule.

(1)

(a)

- (i) An applicant who has submitted a complete land use application as described in Subsection (1)(c), including the payment of all application fees, is entitled to substantive review of the application under the land use regulations:
 - (A) in effect on the date that the application is complete; and
 - (B) applicable to the application or to the information shown on the application.
- (ii) An applicant is entitled to approval of a land use application if the application conforms to the requirements of the applicable land use regulations, land use decisions, and development standards in effect when the applicant submits a complete application and pays application fees, unless:
 - (A) the land use authority, on the record, formally finds that a compelling, countervailing public interest would be jeopardized by approving the application and specifies the compelling, countervailing public interest in writing; or
 - (B) in the manner provided by local ordinance and before the applicant submits the application, the municipality formally initiates proceedings to amend the municipality's land use regulations in a manner that would prohibit approval of the application as submitted.
- (b) The municipality shall process an application without regard to proceedings the municipality initiated to amend the municipality's ordinances as described in Subsection (1)(a)(ii)(B) if:
 - (i) 180 days have passed since the municipality initiated the proceedings; and

(ii)

- (A) the proceedings have not resulted in an enactment that prohibits approval of the application as submitted; or
- (B) during the 12 months prior to the municipality processing the application, or multiple applications of the same type, are impaired or prohibited under the terms of a temporary land use regulation adopted under Section 10-9a-504.
- (c) A land use application is considered submitted and complete when the applicant provides the application in a form that complies with the requirements of applicable ordinances and pays all applicable fees.
- (d) A subsequent incorporation of a municipality or a petition that proposes the incorporation of a municipality does not affect a land use application approved by a county in accordance with Section 17-27a-508.
- (e) Unless a phasing sequence is required in an executed development agreement, a municipality shall, without regard to any other separate and distinct land use application, accept and process a complete land use application.
- (f) The continuing validity of an approval of a land use application is conditioned upon the applicant proceeding after approval to implement the approval with reasonable diligence.
- (g) A municipality may not impose on an applicant who has submitted a complete application a requirement that is not expressed in:
 - (i) this chapter;
 - (ii) a municipal ordinance in effect on the date that the applicant submits a complete application, subject to Subsection 10-9a-509(1)(a)(ii); or
 - (iii) a municipal specification for public improvements applicable to a subdivision or development that is in effect on the date that the applicant submits an application.

- (h) A municipality may not impose on a holder of an issued land use permit or a final, unexpired subdivision plat a requirement that is not expressed:
 - (i) in a land use permit;
 - (ii) on the subdivision plat;
 - (iii) in a document on which the land use permit or subdivision plat is based;
 - (iv) in the written record evidencing approval of the land use permit or subdivision plat;
 - (v) in this chapter;
 - (vi) in a municipal ordinance; or
 - (vii) in a municipal specification for residential roadways in effect at the time a residential subdivision was approved.
- (i) Except as provided in Subsection (1)(j) or (k), a municipality may not withhold issuance of a certificate of occupancy or acceptance of subdivision improvements because of an applicant's failure to comply with a requirement that is not expressed:
 - (i) in the building permit or subdivision plat, documents on which the building permit or subdivision plat is based, or the written record evidencing approval of the land use permit or subdivision plat; or
 - (ii) in this chapter or the municipality's ordinances.
- (j) A municipality may not unreasonably withhold issuance of a certificate of occupancy where an applicant has met all requirements essential for the public health, public safety, and general welfare of the occupants, in accordance with this chapter, unless:
 - (i) the applicant and the municipality have agreed in a written document to the withholding of a certificate of occupancy; or
 - (ii) the applicant has not provided a financial assurance for required and uncompleted public landscaping improvements or infrastructure improvements in accordance with an applicable local ordinance.
- (k) A municipality may not conduct a final inspection required before issuing a certificate of occupancy for a residential unit that is within the boundary of an infrastructure financing district, as defined in Section 17B-1-102, until the applicant for the certificate of occupancy provides adequate proof to the municipality that any lien on the unit arising from the infrastructure financing district's assessment against the unit under Title 11, Chapter 42, Assessment Area Act, has been released after payment in full of the infrastructure financing district's assessment against that unit.
- (I) A municipality:
 - (i) may require the submission of a private landscaping plan, as defined in Section 10-9a-604.5, before landscaping is installed; and
 - (ii) may not withhold an applicant's building permit or certificate of occupancy because the applicant has not submitted a private landscaping plan.
- (2) A municipality is bound by the terms and standards of applicable land use regulations and shall comply with mandatory provisions of those regulations.
- (3) A municipality may not, as a condition of land use application approval, require a person filing a land use application to obtain documentation regarding a school district's willingness, capacity, or ability to serve the development proposed in the land use application.
- (4) Upon a specified public agency's submission of a development plan and schedule as required in Subsection 10-9a-305(8) that complies with the requirements of that subsection, the specified public agency vests in the municipality's applicable land use maps, zoning map, hookup fees, impact fees, other applicable development fees, and land use regulations in effect on the date of submission.

(5)

- (a) If sponsors of a referendum timely challenge a project in accordance with Subsection 20A-7-601(6), the project's affected owner may rescind the project's land use approval by delivering a written notice:
 - (i) to the local clerk as defined in Section 20A-7-101; and
 - (ii) no later than seven days after the day on which a petition for a referendum is determined sufficient under Subsection 20A-7-607(5).
- (b) Upon delivery of a written notice described in Subsection (5)(a) the following are rescinded and are of no further force or effect:
 - (i) the relevant land use approval; and
 - (ii) any land use regulation enacted specifically in relation to the land use approval.

(6)

- (a) After issuance of a building permit, a municipality may not:
 - (i) change or add to the requirements expressed in the building permit, unless the change or addition is:
 - (A) requested by the building permit holder; or
 - (B) necessary to comply with an applicable state building code; or
 - (ii) revoke the building permit or take action that has the effect of revoking the building permit.
- (b) Subsection (6)(a) does not prevent a municipality from issuing a building permit that contains an expiration date defined in the building permit.

B L ▲ N D I N G | 10.3.4 Amendment Procedures

- A. Statement Of Public Policy: It is the intent of the municipality that these regulations, which include this title and the official map, have been established for the purpose of promoting sound and desirable development and of maintaining a stable community. In harmony with this purpose, this title and map shall not be amended except to: 1) correct an obvious error or oversight in the regulations; or 2) recognize changing conditions in the community, which require that amendments be adopted for the promotion of the public health, safety and general welfare. In conformity with this statement of policy, the city council may initiate amendments, or any person, firm or corporation may initiate amendments, in the manner hereinafter set forth.
- B. Type Of Amendments And How Made:
 - 1. Amendments shall be of two (2) types:
 - a. Language amendments which seek to change the wording of this title; and
 - b. Map amendments which seek to change the district boundary lines on the official map.
 - 2. Applications for amendments of either type shall be made to the building inspector, who may develop forms for this purpose. The application shall include, among other things:
 - a. The name and address of the applicant; and
 - b. The applicant's interest in the application; and
 - c. The nature and effect of the proposed amendment; and
 - d. A description and map of any area sought to be rezoned; and
 - e. A statement of the legal basis for such an amendment, whether to correct an error or to recognize changing conditions.
 - 3. The building inspector shall assemble the application and shall forward a copy to planning commission and to any other agency which he feels might be affected by the amendment. Any such agency may require additional information of a reasonable and pertinent nature from the applicant.
 - 4. The planning commission shall consider the application and forward its recommendations to the building inspector. Nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit the planning commission from developing close working relationships with the city council in order to apprise the city council of development policies and problems of the municipality.
 - 5. The building inspector shall submit to the city council the completed application, including agency comments and planning commission recommendation.
- C. Public Hearing: No amendment to this title or map shall be enacted until after a public hearing has been held at which all interested parties have had an opportunity to be heard. Notice of such a hearing shall be by posting any affected property for fifteen (15) days prior to such a hearing and by any other method that the city council may provide. Such posting shall include information on the nature of the amendment sought and the date, time and place for the public hearing. The City Planner shall be responsible for notification and posting as prescribed by city council.
- D. Protests To Map Amendments: In the event that twenty percent (20%) of the property owners of the land included within a proposed change, or twenty percent (20%) of the property owners located within two hundred feet (200') from the perimeter of the proposed change file a written protest with the city council at least four (4) hours prior to the time of the public hearing, then and in that event an amendment to the official map shall not become effective except by a favorable vote of four (4) council members.
- E. Intent And Minimum Size:

1. Specified: It is the intent of this title that zoning districts be of such a size as to function effectively and for the benefit of the community or a significant segment of the populace. For that reason, no amendment to this title shall be adopted whereby the zoning classification is changed unless the area to be zoned meets the following minimum size requirements:

R-1	5 acres
R-2	5 acres

I	5 acres
0	1 acre

- 2. How Measured: For the purpose of computing the size of an area for compliance with subsection E1 of this section, there shall be included:
 - a. One-half (1/2) of the area of abutting streets not, however, to exceed fifty feet (50'); and
 - b. All of the area of public rights of way interior to the area being changed; and
 - c. Adjacent and contiguous land within the municipality already zoned in the zoning classification being sought for the new area; and
 - d. Adjacent and contiguous land outside the municipality that is zoned in a similar category or is used substantially for uses similar to those being sought by the applicant.
- F. Filing Fee And Publication Charge: At the time the application is filed requesting change with respect to zoning or building, or uses of land, as contemplated by this title, there shall be paid to the city treasurer a filing fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the purpose of deferring the cost of advertising such public hearing and sending certified letters to the property owners that fall within the 200' proposed change area. The city planner shall notify such applicant of such charge for advertising and shall not proceed with the advertising until such charge has been paid.

Councilmember Grover made a motion to approve the consent agenda and minutes from August 7, 2025 special council meeting and minutes from August 12, 2025 regular council meeting. Councilmember Ewald seconded the motion. Mayor Olsen repeated the motion and asked for discussion or questions. Hearing none, he called for a vote.

Constituting all members thereof, Mayor Olsen declared the motion carried.

6. Declaration of Conflicts of Interest - None

Public Input

• Mar Dawn Palmer was present at the meeting and she wanted to know if the JL Hunt zone change request was going to be discussed at tonight's meeting. It was advised that it is not on the agenda so it won't be discussed tonight. It was explained that the issue was tabled, meaning that more work needs to be done before it's brought back to the council. It will be on the first meeting of September at the 6 PM work session. She read a letter to the council expressing her concern of the zone change. She had a copy of her letter for all the council members. Her letter stated that the majority of the neighborhood hopes that this area isn't rezoned. She asked that Councilmember Bowers excuse herself from voting, citing a conflict of interest. Councilmember Bowers stated that it



doesn't exclude her from being able to vote and she intends to vote on this matter. Mar Dawn stated that she understands there is a need for affordable housing, but she doesn't think that rezoning is the answer.

- Mr. Redd read a letter from Cari Spillman who is the Hunt rentals maintenance manager.
 She cited their application process for tenants, stating they have high quality tenants and hold them to high expectations. They have an online process for tenants to request maintenance. The letter stated that they have a 98% same day response. The letter also cited weed control and garbage control.
- Pam Hosler was present at the meeting and she wanted to report some things that she
 has heard directly from tenants of JL Hunt properties. She cited several different
 problems that the tenants have encountered. She stated that she doesn't think affordable
 housing should be equated with substandard living. She talked about permanent
 foundations and the costs associated with that. She talked about the different prices that
 people are paying for rent.
- Trent Herring made a statement, he thinks that it is great that people are speaking up whether it's for or against an issue. He thinks it's great that there is change that is happening. He asked that we try not to point fingers at people. No matter what, people are going to have something to complain about to their landlord, no matter the place or the person. He believes that affordable housing needs to happen and the city council wants to do it in the right way.

Reports & Action

1. Mayor

a. Resolution - 08-26-2025-1 Approval of City Manager Contract

Blanding City desires to employ a City Administrator to act under the direction of the
Mayor and to serve the City Council, staff, and citizens of Blanding City. The Mayor, in
consultation with the City Council, has negotiated an Employment Contract with Pratt
Glen Redd to serve as the City Administrator of Blanding City. The Employment Contract
sets forth the duties, responsibilities, compensation, benefits, and conditions of
employment for the position of City Administrator. The City Council has reviewed the
terms of said Employment Contract and finds them to be fair and in the best interests of
Blanding City.

Councilmember Ewald made a motion to approve Resolution 08-26-2025-1 approval of the city manager contract with Pratt Redd. Councilmember Grover seconded the motion. Mayor Olsen repeated the motion and asked for discussion or questions. Hearing none, he called for a vote.

Mayor Olsen and Representative Monson attended the UAMPS meeting. They are going
to bring back some more options and opportunities for the city to grow their power
company. They will be added to an upcoming agenda.

2. City Council

- Councilmember Nielson stated that the planning and zoning met and had a robust discussion on the R1 zone. We saw some positive changes there. They are willing to address the mobile home zone as well. He stated that the planning commission is a good group, Linda Swenson has been serving as chair for the commission and is now done with her term. Councilmember Nielson stated that there have been complaints about scooters around town.
- Councilmember Ewald wanted to call another airport meeting to discuss plans and the airport budget. He stated that there are at least ten people on the wait list for hangars.
- Councilmember Bowers had a question about the Moses property. She stated
 that Chad had sent an email asking for an update on that. She asked if it was
 going to be brought back on the agenda. Councilmember Nielson stated that the
 planning commission is working on revising the R1 zone ordinance and that
 potentially could help Moses with their plans.
- Mayor Olsen stated that Chief Bradford has been working on identifying police calls and mapping them out and identifying particular areas and properties that are problem areas.

3. Finance Report/Operational Budget - James Francom

Mr. Francom had the operational budget available for the council to see. He
wanted to point out that the year to date column encompasses the whole year, not
just a certain time period.

4. City Engineer Report - Patrick Parsons

- Mr. Parsons was excited about the rain that came today, but his report is for last month so it doesn't account for today's rain. We've received less than an inch of precipitation since May. He went over the reservoir's volumes. Our accumulative volume is sitting at about 66%. We've been sending water from Starvation to the 3rd reservoir to keep it full. Recapture is at about 30%. He stated that it is a possibility of having our mountain lines dry up. Historically, it has happened once or twice. Well B is running at full capacity and is looking good. He stated that despite such a dry year, he still sees quite a bit of watering at homes and businesses. He wondered if we needed to go from yellow tier to orange tier. He stated that the annual mountain tunnel walk through is scheduled for September 18th. If there are too many conflicts with that date then it can be rescheduled, but they need to be aware that cold weather is coming and he will also be out of town for a couple of weeks.
- Deep well: the preliminary plans for the well house structure and the yard are done and tri-hurst will do the construction on that when it's ready.
- Energy fuels gas line: the feasibility study for the routing of the gas line is done.



The next step will be for city staff to identify where there will be utility crossings.

- Sewer master plan: The final draft is done. It will be used to look for deficiencies in the system and potential future projects.
- Crack seal project: RFP has been posted. Mr. Parsons has reached out to several contractors. The job description for seasonal help has been posted and there is already one application. They are working on quotes for a crack seal machine. Mr. Parsons has been working with the San Juan transportation district to try and get funding for this project. Councilmember Grover sits on the board for that organization. Mr. Parsons will attend their next meeting.
- Highway 191: We share a portion of 191 with UDOT and there should be funding for some improvements of the center and main section of 191. Specifically for curb and gutter. UDOT has a program called quality solutions that would supply the funding.

Business Items

- 1. **Resolution** 08-26-2025-2 Blanding City Water Conservation Plan
 - Blanding City recognizes the importance of sustainable water management and
 conservation for the health, safety, and welfare of its residents and future
 generations. The State of Utah requires municipalities to prepare and update
 water conservation plans periodically. Blanding City Staff, with the support of city
 leadership, has updated the City's Water Conservation Plan in June 2025 to
 reflect current usage, infrastructure, goals, and conservation strategies. The
 updated Water Conservation Plan includes realistic and actionable steps to
 reduce water consumption, encourage responsible water use, and ensure
 long-term availability of this essential resource.
 - Mr. Parsons stated that this update is required by the state, and our plan has been approved by the state with two enthusiastic thumbs up. Mr. Redd highlighted a couple things from the plan, such as the rate structure. Councilmember Grover asked why the irrigation company's raw water meter was the city's concern. Mr. Parsons stated that the water comes from the Recapture line and we share the water. Councilmember Grover stated that the line is owned by the conservancy district and the irrigation company. Mr. Parsons stated that is correct and we get water from those lines, so that is probably why it is stated in the plan that way. The irrigation company does the repairs and maintenance on those lines.

Councilmember Ewald made a motion to approve Resolution 08-26-2025-2 accepting the Blanding City Water Conservation Plan. Councilmember Nielson seconded the motion. Mayor Olsen repeated the motion and asked for discussion or questions. Hearing none, he called for a vote.

- 2. **Resolution** 08-26-2025-3 Election Canvass Approval
 - The City Council of Blanding City, Utah, is required by law to canvas the returns of municipal elections. The canvass of the 2025 Blanding City Council election held on August 12, 2025, has been completed and the votes have been counted and reviewed. The total number of ballots cast was 581, with a voter turnout of 38.89%, and the vote counts for City Council candidates were as follows:
 - Chad Moses 186 votes (17.46%)
 - Erik Merlin Grover 263 votes (24.69%)
 - Jesse Glen Grover 227 votes (21.31%)
 - Stacy Harrison 166 votes (15.59%)
 - Bret Allen Hosler 223 votes (20.94%)
 - Pursuant to Utah law, the candidates moving forward from this election to the general election are Chad Moses, Erik Merlin Grover, Jesse Glen Grover, and Bret Allen Hosler. The City Council of Blanding City, Utah, that: 1. The official canvass of the 2025 Blanding City Council election is hereby approved and accepted as presented. 2. The results of the canvass shall be recorded in the official minutes of the City Council. 3. The City Recorder is directed to certify the results and take all necessary steps to move forward with the general election process.
 - They discussed the votes that were returned, noncurable and not able to be counted. They discussed that moving forward, they will advertise and educate on how, when and where to turn in ballots.

• Cameron Carter, Carson Miller and Allison Padgen with Bike Utah joined the meeting virtually and made a presentation complete with slides, pictures, graphs and the input that they have gathered through their surveys, public input and research. Bike Utah is a non-profit planning firm and they are contracted to do the downtown improvement plan for Blanding City. The purpose of this plan is to assess current conditions and recommend strategies to improve Blanding's downtown. This will include transportation, land use and zoning, street amenities, wayfinding and branding. Bike Utah will send a PDF draft plan to the council for review and feedback and they will also present the plan in October or November, they will coordinate with Ben on that.

2. Vacation Bonus Time - Charlie Taylor

• Councilmember Taylor wanted to be present for this discussion item, so it will be brought back when he is present.

3. Education Policy - Pratt Redd

• Mr. Redd went over some of the edits that he made to the education policy. The discussion focused on proposed changes to the city's education policy, aiming to streamline approval for employee training. Key adjustments include requiring prior approval for all city-funded education and training. For requests costing \$3,000 or less, the mayor or their designee can approve, while requests exceeding \$3,000 need approval from both the mayor and city council to ensure transparency and alignment with city goals. The policy retains a repayment obligation if an employee leaves early after receiving city-funded education. The next step is to formalize these changes into a resolution for an upcoming council meeting.

Councilmember Grover made a motion to adjourn. Councilmember Nielson seconded the motion. Mayor Olsen repeated the motion and asked for discussion or questions, hearing none, he called for a vote.

Good morning Pratt and Members of Blanding City Council: RE: JL Hunt Properties LLC zone change from R2 to Mobile Home

I just wanted to address a couple of things with this request. As owner of the land in question I am simply requesting a re-zone from R2 to Mobile Home. On August 12th this was on the agenda for City Council, and I understand during public comment there was quite a bit of negative comment toward myself, our maintenance crew and selected homes. I'm happy to address any specific issue anyone has with my homes, crew or business, however I believe that much of what was said against JL Hunt Properties in that meeting was not accurate. More importantly, I don't believe the information/comments would even weigh into the zoning decision before city council.

The issue before you as city council members, as I understand, is that a landowner is asking for a zone change, and if that change is made, plans to bring several homes to Blanding, spending well over a million dollars in the next several months, all in compliance with building code of Blanding City. This is an entirely new development and comparing to older rentals in town (including mine) just doesn't make sense, for example, any other company could make this proposal..., or I could sell the property to another company, etc. The question is simply whether Blanding City wants to allow the zone change being requested by the landowner and add several low-cost houses in a timely manner to a very specific area (again, meeting all requirements of city code), that's it. Isn't that the decision at hand?

Because our business was brought up I want you to know that we address nearly every maintenance question within 24 hours and have on call crew to address emergencies and spend hundreds of thousands of dollars in maintenance and upkeep each year. We offer safe and quality homes to our tenants.

To me (unless there is some major issue I'm not seeing) the proposed zone change seems like a very simple and positive move for the city to address a critical and growing need. As long as the focus is on the needs of the city as a whole rather than the voice of a few negative and seemingly selfish voices I would ask that the council vote in favor of this zoning change.

I have a personal interest in Blanding and housing its residents at a reasonable rate. My investment dollars could easily go to another city and make more money. I hope you understand I'm offering Blanding something of value here that is a rare opportunity. I have an interest in helping people in Blanding and am not only trying to make a buck, which is actually very difficult to do with rentals in Blanding.

Many important and contributing citizens in Blanding got their start living in mobile homes in town. I know I did. For the past several years and especially right now, it is extremely difficult to find a place to rent in Blanding and by not approving this change it is denying that opportunity to others. If you have further reservations, I invite you to drive to the property in question and ask yourself if this location would be appropriate for mobile homes? I specifically purchased this land thinking it would be an ideal location for this purpose.

This is a simple proposal that will bring low-cost housing to Blanding in a short time and in a small and specific area all being developed following Blanding city codes and ordinances.

I am writing today because I need to get an answer reasonably soon. Can we get this back on the agenda and a vote taken, please? **If any council member has any concern or hesitation with approving this change, I ask you can you please contact me and let me know so I can address it?

Again, for anyone with specific concerns regarding my current businesses or homes in town I invite them to contact me directly and I will address the concern quickly and decisively.



RESOLUTION 09-09-2025-1

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE SAN JUAN STRIKE FORCE INTER-LOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN SAN JUAN COUNTY, MONTICELLO CITY, BLANDING CITY, AND THE UTAH HIGHWAY PATROL

- WHEREAS, the Utah Inter-local Cooperation Act authorizes public agencies to enter into cooperative agreements to provide joint services and exercise shared powers; and
- 2. **WHEREAS**, San Juan County, Monticello City, Blanding City, and the Utah Highway Patrol have, for over twenty years, collaborated in operating the San Juan Strike Force, a regional law enforcement entity dedicated to combating the production, trade, and use of illegal controlled substances; and
- 3. **WHEREAS**, the Strike Force is overseen by an Administrative Board, serving in an advisory capacity, and an Executive Board, exercising voting authority and governance over policies, leadership, finances, and operations; and
- 4. **WHEREAS**, the Strike Force is administered by a Unit Commander, a certified law enforcement officer responsible for operational oversight, financial records, and reporting; and
- 5. **WHEREAS**, the Strike Force operates within San Juan County and its participating jurisdictions, providing coordinated investigations, prosecution support, and a county-wide database for controlled substance-related cases; and
- 6. **WHEREAS**, funding is provided through contributions of manpower, resources, and an annually approved budget, with all property seized under drug laws referred to the Strike Force for follow-up and legal proceedings; and
- 7. **WHEREAS**, liability insurance is maintained for officers and agencies, and participants indemnify their officers for claims exceeding coverage; and
- 8. **WHEREAS**, the Inter-local Agreement establishing the San Juan Strike Force provides for a duration of up to fifty (50) years, with provisions for withdrawal, termination, and proportional distribution of property and funds upon dissolution; and
- 9. **WHEREAS**, the City Council of Blanding City finds that continued participation in the San Juan Strike Force is in the best interest of the citizens of Blanding City and promotes public health, safety, and welfare;



10. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BLANDING CITY, UTAH:

- SECTION 1. The Blanding City Council hereby approves the San Juan Strike Force Inter-local Agreement, in substantially the form presented, and authorizes continued participation in the San Juan Strike Force.
- SECTION 2. The Mayor is authorized to execute the Inter-local Agreement and any necessary documents on behalf of Blanding City, and the City Recorder is authorized to attest to the same.
- **SECTION 3.** This resolution shall become effective upon adoption.

SAN JUAN STRIKE FORCE INTER-LOCAL AGREEMENT

This is an agreement by and among the undersigned parties creating an inter-local Law Enforcement Strike Force.

This Agreement is made and execute by and among the following undersigned jurisdictions: San Juan County, Monticello City, Blanding City, and Utah Highway Patrol.

RATIONAL FOR ESTABLISHING STRIKE FORCE

WHEREAS, 11-13-1 et seq., Utah Code Annotated, 1953, as amended, commonly known as the Interlocal Cooperation Act, authorizes public agencies to enter joint agreements for the promotion of police protection; and

WHEREAS, all the parties hereto are public agencies as defined by the Inter-local Cooperation Act; and

WHEREAS, all of the parties hereto have experienced within their jurisdiction a continuing problem of the production, manufacture, trade and use of illegal controlled substances; and

WHEREAS, the effective investigation and prosecution of sales, use and manufacturing of controlled substances requires specialized personnel, able to investigate on a regional basis and in a cooperative arrangement;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties do mutually agree, pursuant to the terms and provisions on the Inter-local Cooperation Act, as follows:

SECTION ONE RATIFICATION AND MISSION STATEMENT

1.1 The creation of the San Juan Strike Force (hereinafter "Strike Force") is hereby ratified by the parties. The parties have not contemplated nor intended to establish a separate legal entity under the terms of this Inter-Local Agreement. The Strike Force is created by the participants pursuant to the Inter-local Cooperation Act for the purpose of investigating and prosecuting the illegal importation, manufacture, use and sale of controlled substances under state, federal and local laws within the San Juan County area as provided herein.

SECTION TWO GOVERNING BOARDS

2.1 The Strike Force shall utilize two boards in its administration and governance, and Administrative Board acting in an advisory capacity and an Executive Board vested with voting authority to govern and regulate the Strike Force.

2.1.1 Administrative Board

- A. The Administrative Board shall consist of the San Juan County Attorney or his/her designee, (who shall act as the chair of the Board), the head of each participant's law enforcement office/department or a duty appointed assistant thereto, as determined by the participant.
- B. Members of the Administrative Board shall designate (on or about the first of January every other year) one of their members to serve in an "at large" position on the Executive Board for a period of two (2) years. The designated "at large" representative shall have voting status as a member of the Executive Board.
- 1. The duties of the Administrative Board shall be to:
 - a. Review the activities of the Strike Force generally;
 - b. Recommend a Strike Force Unit Commander;
 - c. Request financial audits as deemed necessary, but ensure at least one audit per year is performed with an additional audit done upon completion of any Unit Commander's term;
 - d. Issue an annual report of the preceding year's activities to the participants;
 - e. Conduct program evaluation;
 - f. Seek federal and state grant money as may be available;
 - g. Recommend the appointment of supervisors and staff as needed;
 - h. Recommend operating policy as needed; and
 - i. Recommend appropriate training.
- C. <u>Meetings</u>: The Administrative Board shall have no less than two meetings per calendar year during the months of March and October, for the purpose of fulfilling their duties as specified in this agreement.

2.1.2 Executive Board

The Executive Board of the Strike Force is comprised of members of the Administrative Board that have acquired voting status. The Board shall select at its first meeting during a calendar year, a Chair and a Vice-Chair for the purpose of conducting the business of the Board. Any reference in this Agreement to an action by vote shall be referred to as a vote of the entire Executive Board.

- A. The Executive Board shall be made up of a representative from each jurisdiction that provides at least one officer or the monetary equivalent to the strike Force a minimum of twelve (12) months of every three (3) years, plus an at-large member as appointed by the Administrative Board.
- B. Non-voting participants are those who have provided other resources.
- 1. The duties of the Executive Board shall be to:
 - a. Govern the activities of the Strike Force generally;
 - b. Adopt by-laws or rules for regulating the activities of the Strike Force;
 - c. Select a Strike Force Unit Commander;
 - d. Make and execute contracts or agreements necessary for the performance of its duties and the exercise of its powers under the Inter-local Cooperation Act;
 - e. Own, lease, operate, maintain, repair any equipment of facility useful in carrying out the purpose of the Strike Force;
 - f. Receive property, grants, gifts, supplies, materials, contributions, forfeitures, and any benefit derived there from for the provision of law enforcement services as provided by this Agreement and in accordance with state and federal law;
 - g. Conduct financial audits as deemed necessary, ensuring that at least one audit per year is performed with and additional audit done upon completion on any Unit Commander's term;
 - h. Issue an annual report of the preceding year's activities to the participants and public;
 - i. Conduct program evaluation;
 - j. Seek federal and state grant money as may be available;
 - k. Appointment of supervisors and staff as needed;
 - I. Establish operating policy as needed;
 - m. Coordinate training as appropriate; and
 - n. Provide insurance as specified in this Agreement.
- C. <u>Meeting</u>: The Executive Board shall have no less than two meetings per calendar year during the months of March and October, for the purpose of fulfilling their duties as specified in this Agreement.

SECTION THREE STRIKE FORCE ADMINISTRATION

- 3.1 The Strike Force shall primarily investigate crimes related to controlled substances. The Strike Force will notify individual jurisdiction of all crimes discovered in their geographic boundaries, provided, such notification may be delayed if, in discretion of the Strike Force Unit Commander, notification will hinder a current Strike Force Investigation.
 - 3.1.1 The Strike Force shall be headed by a Unit Commander.
 - a. The Unit Commander shall be a Certified Law Enforcement Officer.
 - b. The Unit Commander shall be solely in charge of directing the Strike Force activities subject to approval to the Executive Board;
 - c. The Unit Commander shall be responsible for the administrative activity of the Strike Force including maintain financial records and reporting as required by the Executive Board.
 - d. The Unit Commander shall perform such other duties as required by the Executive Board.
 - 3.1.2 All Peace Officers of the Strike Force shall be Certified Law Enforcement or Correctional Officers as defined by the laws of the State of Utah.

SECTION FOUR STRIKE FORCE JURISDICTION

- 4.1 All of the participants acknowledge the territorial jurisdiction of the strike Force to be that of San Juan County. The Signatories hereto expressly consent to the investigations conducted by the Strike Force within their respective geographical boundaries provided that Strike Force Investigators not from the jurisdiction in which an investigation is conducted shall not be considered agents of that jurisdiction nor shall jurisdiction assume any liability for the actions of the strike Force except as provided in Section Seven.
- 4.2 Participating jurisdictions may refer any controlled substance investigations within their jurisdiction to the Strike Force. IN order to maintain a complete county-wide database, all agencies will route drug case information to the Strike Force. The Strike Force may decline any case for cause.

SECTION FIVE SEIZURES AND FORFEITURES

5.1 All seizures and forfeitures of property, funds, vehicles, etc., effected for violations of the Controlled Substances Act shall be referred to the Strike Force for follow-up and forfeiture proceedings in accordance with an pursuant to the State and Federal laws.

SECTION SIX STRIKE FORCE FUNDING

- Except as provided at the sole discretion of the Strike Force, each participant hereto shall absorb all costs associated with their participation. In the event a city contributes manpower on alternating years, the manpower will serve as their contribution only during the years the manpower is with the Strike Force. During the time an entity does not contribute manpower, they must pay the assessments as provided by the Executive Board.
- The Administrative Board will provide for an operating fund for general costs incurred not directly attributable to any participant herein. In an annual budget meeting the Executive Board shall review the budget and expenses of the past year; review a proposed budget for the coming budget. After approval of the budget, the executive Committee shall make proposed assessments for the coming fiscal year.
- 6.3 The Administrative Board shall review the budget and assessments proposed by the Strike Force Commander and within 30 days shall submit said budget with any comments to the Executive Board for final approval. Once the Executive Board has approved the budget and assessments, the budget shall be submitted to the participating entities for approval in accordance with their respective budget approval processes.
 - 6.3.1 Assessments shall be applied within 30 days of the beginning of the fiscal year unless other arrangements are made with the approval of the Executive Board.
 - 6.3.2 The Executive Board shall provide the needed office space for the Strike Force. The Executive Board may acquire other facilities as needed.

SECTION SEVEN INSURANCE AND PARTICIPATING MEMBER LIABILITY

The Strike Force shall procure and keep in force a General Liability and Directors' and Officers' Liability Policy with limits prescribed the Executive Board for the purpose for defending and indemnifying its officers and participating agencies. In no event shall this section be construed with respect to third parties as a waiver of any governmental immunity to which the parties are otherwise entitled. Each

participant shall indemnify its own officers for any claim of liability arising while participating in the Strike Force for amounts exceeding Strike Force liability policy limits.

SECTION EIGHT STRIKE FORCE DURATION AND DISSOLUTION

- This Agreement shall be in effect for an indefinite period of time not to exceed 50 years, provided, however, that:
 - Any party may withdraw at the end of the fiscal year upon 30 days written notice to the Executive Board.
 - 8.1.2 The Executive Board may terminate the Agreement upon a majority vote of the total membership of the Executive Board.
 - A. Upon withdrawal of any party or termination of this agreement the withdrawing party shall retain that property which it allowed to be used by the Strike Force. Upon termination of this agreement, any property obtained in common shall be sold and the proceeds divided among the current members in proportion to their most recent annual contribution.
 - B. Upon termination of this entire agreement, all total available funds shall be distributed among the currents members in proportion to their most recent annual contribution.
 - 8.1.3 Other jurisdictions, not an original party to this agreement, may join with approval of the Executive Board. The Executive Board may offer investigative service to any jurisdiction without granting membership status or provide such assistance as thought appropriate by the Executive Board.

SECTION NINE STRIKE FORCE POLICY AND PROCEDURES

- 9.1 All participants hereto agree that their personnel working in or with the Strike Force shall follow Strike Force policy and procedures in the case of conflict with their own policy and procedure. If no Strike Force policy or procedure applies, each officer shall be bound by his own department's policies while acting for the Strike Force.
- 9.2 The Strike Force shall have no authority to discipline an officer except that the Unit Commander may suspend an officer from the Strike Force and make recommendations to the Executive Board and responsible department. Removal of an officer, if the officer is the only officer contributed for the current year y a particular department, shall cause the participant to lose voting status unless another officer is contributed to the Strike Force within 15 days.

SECTION TEN MISCELLANEOUS

10.1 Warranties of Participants

Each participant hereby represents and warrants that:

- (i) It is a public agency or public entity within the meaning of the Act and the Inter-local act; and
- (ii) It is duly authorized to execute and deliver this Inter-local Agreement; and
- (iii) There is no litigation or legal governmental action, proceeding, inquiry or investigation pending or threatened by governmental authorities or others or to which such Participant is a party or to which any of its property is subject which if determined adversely to such Participant would individually or in the aggregate a) effect the validity or enforceability of this Inter-local Agreement, or b) otherwise materially adversely affect the ability of such Participant to comply with its obligations hereunder or the transaction contemplated hereby.

10.2 Documents of File

Executed copies of this Inter-local agreement shall be placed on file din the office of the Keeper or Records of each of the Participants and shall remain on file for public inspection during the term of this Inter-local Agreement.

10.3 Amendment

This Agreement may be changed, modified or amended by written agreement of the Participants, upon adoption of a resolution by each of the Participants and upon meeting all other applicable requirements of the Inter-local Act.

10.4 Effective Date

This Inter-local Agreement shall become effective immediately upon the execution of a resolution approving this Agreement by each of the Participants which shall include the approval as to form by each participant's respective attorney.

10.5 Laws of Utah

It is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that this agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Utah both as to interpretation and performance.

10.6 <u>Severability of Provisions</u>

If any provision of this agreement is held invalid, the remainder of the agreement shall not be affected thereby as such as remainder would then continue to conform to the terms and requirements of applicable law.

10.7 <u>Captions and Headings</u>

The captions and heading herein are for convenience of reference only and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any sections or provisions of this Agreement.

10.8 <u>Broad Construction</u>

It is the intention of the Participants that this joint and cooperative undertaking contemplated in the Agreement be broadly construed to include all actions, undertakings and objectives permitted or contemplated by the provision of the Act, and any other applicable law, insofar as such provisions related to fostering and protecting public health. The provisions of this Agreement shall be construed as broadly as necessary to accomplish the purposes and objectives set forth herein and pursuant to State Law.

10.9 <u>Counterparts</u>

This agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute but one of the same instrument.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have affixed their signature hereto upon resolution of their governing body as required by law and join and give effect to the Agreement.

RESOLUTION 09-09-2025-2

A RESOLUTION UPDATING THE BUILDING PERMIT FEE SCHEDULE FOR BLANDING CITY TO FOLLOW INTERNATIONAL CODE COUNCIL BUILDING VALUATION DATA

- 1. **WHEREAS**, the International Code Council (ICC) publishes Building Valuation Data (BVD), which are average construction costs per square foot used by jurisdictions nationwide to help determine building permit fees; and
- 2. **WHEREAS,** ICC Building Valuation Data is updated semi-annually to reflect fluctuations in construction costs, and provides consistent, standardized values across construction types and occupancy groups; and
- 3. **WHEREAS**, Blanding City currently uses a fee schedule and permit program based on two separate ICC rates that have not fully aligned; and
- 4. WHEREAS, the City Council finds it to be in the public interest to modernize the City's building permit fee schedule by adopting the ICC Building Valuation Data as the baseline for determining permit fees, while implementing reasonable caps to avoid excessive increases to builders; and
- 5. **WHEREAS**, in adopting this update, the City Council intends to:
 - Apply a maximum multiplier of 1.0% for new construction projects, and
 - Apply a maximum multiplier of 0.5% for remodel projects, and
 - Allow the City Manager and Building Department, at their discretion, to reduce the multiplier to 0.75% (0.0075) in the event ICC valuations create an undue burden on builders;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BLANDING CITY, UTAH:

SECTION 1. The Blanding City Building Permit Fee Schedule is hereby updated to adopt the International Code Council Building Valuation Data (BVD) as the basis for calculating building permit fees, consistent with the provisions outlined in this resolution.

SECTION 2. The Building Department, under the direction of the City Manager, shall administer the fee schedule, apply the designated multipliers, and review ICC updates semi-annually to ensure fees remain current and equitable.



SECTION 3. This resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption and shall govern all building permit applications submitted thereafter.

For the Blanding project, we will utilize a four-man crew. One team member will operate the high-pressure air nozzle to clean out cracks, another will drive the truck, a third will apply crack seal with the wand, and the fourth will assist with traffic control to ensure vehicles safely navigate around the work zone. We will complete the project in sections, sealing half of the road at a time to allow traffic to pass while the crack seal cools and sets. Our expected production rate is approximately 1.5 to 2 pallets of crack seal material per day.

Our pricing for this project is \$4,800 per pallet of crack seal. Each pallet contains 2.1 tons of material and can cover approximately 15,000 linear feet of cracks that are ½" or less in width. We have chosen to bid per pallet for ease of tracking and accuracy. Bidding by lane mile is challenging due to unknown road conditions, but using a per-pallet structure allows us to provide an accurate count of material used each morning or evening. For the estimated 20–30 miles of roadway, we anticipate using approximately 30 pallets of crack seal material.
