

Building Permits: Do you Need One?



Not just new buildings, but renovations, electric, plumbing, outbuildings and more require a permit.

Don't let the **liability** fall on you, get a permit first!

Building Permits: Protect your work!

While getting a permit for your home improvement project isn't the sexiest part of the process, it is important!

Projects not covered by a permit are often ineligible for insurance coverage and could lead to more money out of your pocket in case of an incident. Here are some commonly missed permits:

- If your project involves changes to your electrical or plumbing
- If you are adding an outbuilding or extending the roof of a building
- If you are moving or affecting a wall in your house
- Some landscaping like retaining walls

Luckily we have a wonderful staff that can walk you through the process, if your project doesn't require a permit, we'll let you know!

BLM and USDA Forest Service Release Draft Management Plan for Bears Ears National Monument.



On Friday March 8th the BLM and Forest Service released their draft plan for the Bears Ears National Monument (BENM) for Public Comment. the public only has 90 days to make substantive comments, so it's important to learn what you can and make your comment before the expected June 11th last day to comment. Here are a few bits to get you started.

The draft includes 5 alternate plans that span a range of management options from taking no action to much more restrictive options. Plan A represents no change with B-E

management prefers plan E, but may take parts of any of the alternates for the final plan. You can learn about the plans, including looking at maps and other resources by following THIS LINK.

We encourage everyone to take time examining the documents and plans before making a comment. Making an emotional comment that doesn't cover topics in the alternates may lead to its dismissal. Only comments that cover substantive content relating to the alternates will be considered in the final plan.

plans showing other options. Currently As the process moves forward we'll do our best to keep you informed with resources and updates that will help you make the best comments. Here are a few to look forward to:

- The city will hold a public meeting to talk about some of the alternates and how to make a substantive comment
- There will be a public meeting held by the BLM in Blanding in the next few months.

Meetings such as these will be helpful in the planning process and making sure your voice is heard.

OHV's on City Streets



With warmer days ahead of us, Blanding City Police would like to remind the public about the legal use of Off-Highway Vehicles on city streets. This policy is there for public safety!

- A driver's license is required to ride on city
- OHV's are not allowed on Main St or Center St except for direct crossings
- OHV drivers must obey all traffic laws
- Permitted use is for point to point travel, not for pleasure cruising.
- Any user of an OHV under the age of 18 must be wearing proper safety gear including a helmet.
