2. One/Two Lot Subdivision

 Mr. Herring explained that both of these topics have been discussed in previous meetings, both in the planning and zoning and city council meetings. And now was the time for the public to voice their comments and opinions. There was no public comment for these topics.

Councilmember Nielson made a motion to exit the public hearing for R2 zoning ordinance amendments and one/two lot subdivision. Councilmember Taylor seconded the motion. Mayor Pro Temp Bowers repeated the motion and asked for discussion or questions. Hearing none, she called for a vote.

Public Input

Trina Hosler was present at the meeting and wanted to give the council a heads up on a proposed zoning change by JL Hunt properties. This topic will be on the agenda for the next council meeting. She handed out a map of the area in question. The proposal is to rezone it to a mobile home zone. They discussed the size of the lots in the proposal. Trina said that letters have been sent out to neighbors informing them of the proposal. There will be a public hearing and it will be on the agenda as a discussion item for possible action on August 12th.

Reports

1. Mayor

• Mayor Olsen wanted to excuse Councilmember Grover and sends his thoughts and condolences to his family with the passing of Merlin Grover.

2. City Council

- Councilmember Bowers stated that some one brought up an issue with her and that is the amount of skunks at the fire station. Councilmember Taylor said that there are skunks everywhere. She asked if there is anything that we can do about it. Mr. Herring said that it is on his list of things to address.
- Councilmember Bowers wanted to clarify that in the discussions on a splash pad that the city council was in agreement to move forward with finding funding. Mr. Herring stated that the majority of the funding was going to come through the San Juan Clean Energy Foundation. Commissioner Stubbs put in a grant application



for that funding but was not approved, based on them not knowing where the rest of the funding would come from. Commissioner Stubbs was under the impression that council wasn't on board with the splash pad, but that isn't the case.

3. James Francom - Finance Report/Operational Budget

 Mr. Herring stated that this report is similar to the amended budget report that the council saw at the last council meeting. No one had any questions on the finance report.

4. Patrick Parsons - City Engineer Report

- Mr. Parsons said that our reservoirs are at about 67% all together. He stated that
 we've been utilizing the water out of starvation to keep the 3rd reservoir full. The
 average accumulation for this time of year is about 21 inches and we are barely
 above 13.
- Well B (2) that was broken down was being worked on and the contractor installed a new pump, but it was the wrong size. They are fixing it and replacing it with the correct one. All costs are completely on the contractor.
- Councilmember Taylor asked about a construction water truck that was getting water from a hydrant. He asked if they could get untreated water elsewhere. Mr. Parsons said that can be looked into, but metering it could pose a challenge. Mr. Parsons stated that our wells are tied into our treatment plant.
- Mr. Parsons said that every 5 years we are required by the state to update our water conservation plan. It was last done in 2020. He has updated it and submitted it and it has already been approved. It will have to be approved by the city council at the next meeting.
- Mr. Parsons and Mr. Herring made a plan to catch up on the crack sealing that is desperately needed. The hope is to get it done this year as temperatures cool down. The plan is to do some of it internally and to contract some of it out. They have looked into the costs of equipment as well as seasonal employees to help with this job.

2. **Resolution** - 07-22-2025-2 Sewer Policy Update

• Blanding City owns and operates a municipal sewer system to provide essential public services to residential and commercial customers within and outside city limits. Blanding City desires to improve transparency and flexibility in its sewer billing processes for landlords and property managers, the City Council recognizes that different property types—such as single-family homes versus multi-unit complexes—require distinct approaches for account setup and billing administration. It is in the City's best interest to formally establish two account types—Residential (Existing) and Commercial (Existing) & High-Density (Newly Added)—to improve service and clarity in billing practices. Landlords and property managers will be allowed to choose whether sewer charges are billed directly to tenants or to the owner/manager's account, as appropriate under each category. If a Landlord or Property Manager chooses the High Density billing option and has a connection to Blanding City Water, they must also use the High Density billing method for water.

3. **Resolution** - 07-22-2025-3 Contract for Effluent Sewer Lagoon Discharge

Blanding City owns and operates a wastewater lagoon system which discharges treated effluent in accordance with state and federal environmental regulations. JM Grover Enterprise, along with Erik M. Grover, Janalee B. Grover, Boyd J.



Grover, and Jeana Grover, residents of Blanding, San Juan County, Utah (collectively "Grover Parties"), desire to use the treated effluent water discharged from the lagoon for irrigation purposes. The proposed reuse of lagoon effluent for irrigation has mutual benefits, including water conservation, responsible reuse of treated wastewater, and support for local agricultural activities. The terms and conditions governing this reuse are outlined in the contract, which has been reviewed and found acceptable by City administration and legal counsel. The City Council finds that entering into this agreement is in the best interest of Blanding City and its residents.

Councilmember Taylor made a motion to approve Resolution 07-22-2025-3, accepting the contract for effluent sewer lagoon discharge with JM Grover Enterprises. Councilmember Nielson seconded the motion. Mayor Pro Temp Bowers repeated the motion and asked for discussion or questions. Hearing none, she called for a vote.

- 4. **Ordinance** 2025-17 R-2 Zoning Ordinance Amendment Approval
 - Blanding City, through its duly elected City Council, has the authority to establish and amend land use and zoning regulations for the purpose of promoting orderly development and protecting the health, safety, and welfare of its residents. The Planning and Zoning Commission of Blanding City has reviewed proposed amendments to the R-2 Zoning District regulations and held multiple discussions and public meetings to evaluate the proposed changes. The Blanding City Council has likewise reviewed, discussed, and provided input on the proposed amendments in coordination with the Planning and Zoning Commission, resulting in multiple revisions and refinements to the final version. The intent of the amendments is to better clarify, update, and improve zoning practices within the R-2 zone in a manner that is consistent with the City's General Plan and community goals. A final draft of the proposed R-2 zoning amendments, as recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission and accepted by the City Council has been compiled. The Blanding City Council finds the proposed amendments to be in the public interest and beneficial for responsible development within Blanding City.
 - City Council expressed their appreciation to the planning and zoning commission and Ben Muhlestein for their hard work on this.

Councilmember Nielson made a motion to adopt Ordinance 2025-17 accepting the zoning ordinance amendment. Councilmember Taylor seconded the motion. Mayor Pro Temp Bowers repeated the motion and asked for discussion or questions. Hearing none, she called for a vote.

- 5. **Ordinance** 2025-18 One/Two Lot Subdivision Ordinance Approval
 - Blanding City has the authority to regulate the subdivision of land within its jurisdiction to promote orderly growth, protect public health and safety, and ensure compliance with applicable land use regulations. The Blanding City Council recognizes that certain minor subdivisions involving only one or two lots have minimal impact on infrastructure, services, and land use patterns, and therefore warrant a simplified review and approval process. The Blanding City Planning and Zoning Commission serves as the designated Land Use Authority for purposes of subdivision review and approval under the City's Land Use Ordinance. The proposed ordinance, attached hereto as Exhibit A, establishes procedures allowing the Land Use Authority to approve one-lot and two-lot subdivisions, while ensuring consistency with city codes and development standards. This amendment is intended to reduce administrative burden, increase efficiency for residents, and encourage appropriate land development while maintaining necessary oversight. The revised ordinance includes language establishing this streamlined process.
 - They discussed the size of lots that this will pertain to as well as what zones. They also discussed the changes that have been talked about for the R1 zone.

Councilmember Taylor made a motion to approve Ordinance 2025-18 accepting the one/two lot subdivision ordinance. Councilmember Nielson seconded the motion. Mayor Pro Temp Bowers repeated the motion and asked for discussion or questions. Hearing none, she called for a vote.

1. Citizen Academy



• Trooper Brian Robinson was present at the meeting. This is his second year putting together the law enforcement citizen's academy. He wants to make it available to Blanding. Over the course of 4 weeks/1 night a week, they put on police based training for local leadership. The goal is to forge a relationship between law enforcement and leadership. Each law enforcement agency in the area is sponsoring a night and creating several different scenarios for the leadership to take part in. The school administrators and county commissioners will also be invited to participate. He asks that participants come in with a positive attitude and be engaged. Councilmember Taylor wants to highly encourage this academy. Mr. Herring will send the dates and locations to the council via email.

2. White Mesa Ute Water Line Discussion Update

• Mr. Herring stated that they had another meeting with the Ute tribe and he stated that they were very blunt in what our expectations were. They discussed both the culinary water going to White Mesa and the sewer water going up to our sewer ponds. He said that we made it clear that we are not interested in pumping sewer water uphill 10 plus miles. They were understanding of that. They talked about water rights and the barriers that could come up. They talked about another well and a treatment plan. Mr. Herring stated that this would be years in the making. It was asked if they are still willing to foot the entire bill for the project. Mr. Herring stated that we will still have to have discussions about that.

3. Fuels System Project Approved

Mr. Herring stated that this is for the airport. This project was started in 2022. Right now the fuel system is a slow pumping, out of date, single phase system. The original amount that was approved for the project was \$90,000, but it never got completed so it was resubmitted and was approved for \$141,639. We budgeted for \$67,377 & will now only require \$15,738. The system will be upgraded to a three phase system which will be much more efficient.

4. Current Blanding City Education Policy

- The city's current education policy was provided in the packet for the city council to see. Mr. Herring stated that one thing it doesn't have now is a required pay back if we are putting forth money for people's education. He is requesting to add that. He stated that we have implemented it in some cases already with some city employees and getting it in the policy would give us a reference on how to do it. He included some thoughts and ideas on why we should and how we can implement something like that.
- Several council members expressed that this is a good idea and makes sense. If the city is going to fund the education then we need to know that the employee is going to be there for a certain amount of time.

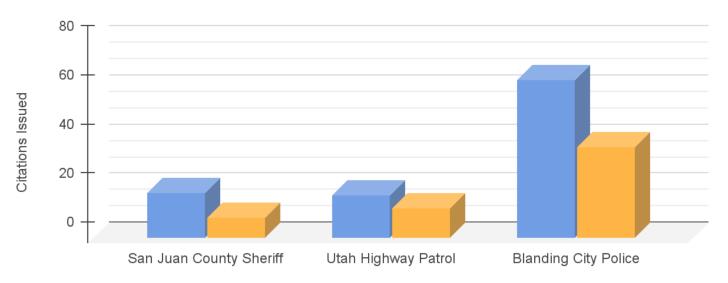

cover the ground underneath all the roof lines in tarps so any debris that may fall will be caught. We will begin stripping the roof the same day and should have it fully stripped in two full work weeks. We will check to make sure there is no plywood or OSB sheathing that is damaged once roof is stripped. Anything damaged we will replace even if we didn't include in original bid. We will then begin to waterproof the roof. We will use ice and water shield on the first three feet of underlayment. We also like to use metal in all valleys and ice and water shield over the top of the metal and then we will use synthetic shingle underlayment everywhere else. The roof slope above the west side of the building that is less than a 2/12 pitch will be all ice and water shield and potential metal instead of shingle depending on the city's request. We will also weave all our underlayment in the valleys. We will then begin to shingle the roof which should take us another two to three weeks to complete. We will make sure everything is flashed properly using step flashing or any other flashings when necessary. We also like to use high quality sealants whenever is necessary such as exposed nails that may be seen on ridge cap or hip cap. Before we finish we will make sure all gutters are completely cleaned out as

well as down spouts. We will double check to make sure all the surroundings are clean. We will then run multiple magnets around the building to catch any nails or metal that may have fallen through the process. That gives us a 4-5 week timeline which is slower but we are just a two man crew. We have around 10 roofs that we've done in the past year and a half and we make sure everything is done right. We could start the project toward end of August to middle of September. Also if our materials end up being a lot more on the estimate then actual cost we are more than willing to workout that difference with you guys. Thanks!

2. Conditions of Use:

- Water shall be used solely for the purposes of maintaining or constructing County Road 285 as identified.
- San Juan County shall coordinate with Blanding City Public Works for scheduling and access.
- No permanent infrastructure may be installed at the well site by San Juan County.
 - Any damage caused to City property or infrastructure shall be repaired or compensated for by the County.
- The City reserves the right to revoke permission at any time if the use interferes with municipal water needs or for any other reasonable cause.
- 3. **Indemnification**: San Juan County agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Blanding City from any claims, losses, or liabilities arising from its use of the



Johnson Creek Well.

AGREEMENT FOR TEMPORARY USE OF BLANDING CITY WELL BY SAN JUAN COUNTY

This Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into as of the ___ day of ______, 2025, by and between Blanding City, a municipal corporation of the State of Utah ("City"), and San Juan County, a political subdivision of the State of Utah ("County").

RECITALS

- WHEREAS, Blanding City owns and operates a municipal water well located at approximately GPS coordinates 37.792639, -109.510469 (hereinafter referred to as the "Johnson Creek Well");
- WHEREAS, San Juan County is undertaking road maintenance and/or construction activities on County Road 285, specifically from the cattle guard at the entrance to U.S. Forest Service territory up to the Dry Wash Reservoir, located on Blue Mountain;
- WHEREAS, the County has requested permission to temporarily utilize the Johnson Creek Well to obtain water necessary for such maintenance activities;
- WHEREAS, the City is willing to allow such temporary use of the well under the terms and conditions set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions set forth herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. Authorized Use

Blanding City hereby grants San Juan County permission to access and use the Johnson Creek Well solely for the purpose of obtaining water for maintenance and construction activities on County Road 285, for the duration of the County's project in 2025.

2. Term

This Agreement shall be effective upon execution by both parties and shall remain in effect until the completion of the County's road maintenance activities, or until November 30, 2025, whichever comes first, unless earlier terminated by either party with 10 days' written notice.

3. Operations and Maintenance

a. The County shall be solely responsible for the operation of the well during its use.

b. The County shall also be responsible for ensuring that all equipment used to withdraw and transport water is compatible with the existing infrastructure and does not damage City property.

c. The County shall ensure the well is secured when not in use, and that water withdrawals are monitored to avoid overuse or system stress.

4. Liability and Damages

The County agrees to assume full responsibility for any damage to the well, related infrastructure, or surrounding City property caused by its operations. The County shall repair or reimburse the City for any such damage in a timely manner.

5. Water Usage Monitoring

The County shall, upon request, provide a reasonable estimate of total water usage from the well. If the City has a flow meter installed, the County agrees to allow the City to read and record meter data before, during, and after use.

6. Indemnification

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the County agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Blanding City, its officers, employees, and agents from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, and expenses arising out of or resulting from the County's use of the Johnson Creek Well.

7. Compliance with Laws

The County shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations related to water use and transportation.

8. No Transfer of Ownership

This Agreement does not convey any property interest or permanent rights in the well or associated facilities. All facilities remain the sole property of Blanding City.

9. Miscellaneous

- Amendments: Any modifications to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by both parties.
- Governing Law: This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Utah.
- Entire Agreement: This document constitutes the entire agreement between the parties regarding the subject matter herein.

CONTRACT FOR BUILDING INSPECTION SERVICES BETWEEN BLANDING CITY AND SAN JUAN SCHOOL DISTRICT

This Agreement is entered into this ____ day of _____, 2025, by and between **Blanding City**, a municipal corporation of the State of Utah, hereinafter referred to as the "City," and **San Juan School District**.

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to set forth the terms and conditions under which the City will provide building inspection services to the District for school properties and facilities located within and outside Blanding City limits.

2. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The City shall provide building inspection services, including but not limited to: structural, electrical, mechanical, and plumbing inspections, as required for the District's construction and renovation projects. Inspections may be performed in person, virtually, or through submitted photo documentation, at the sole discretion of the City's Building Inspector.

3. SCHEDULING

Inspections shall be scheduled and grouped where possible to maximize efficiency. The District agrees to provide reasonable advance notice when scheduling inspections to allow the City to coordinate multiple inspections within a single trip, if possible.

4. FEES

The District shall pay the City \$125.00 per hour for building inspection services, with a minimum charge of one (1) hour per inspection request. For inspection services rendered outside Blanding City limits, the District shall reimburse the City for mileage at the State of Utah's standard mileage reimbursement rate, calculated as round trip mileage from Blanding City to the inspection site.

5. INVOICING AND PAYMENT

The City shall submit an invoice to the District on a monthly basis, detailing the services provided, hours billed, and any applicable mileage charges. The District shall remit payment within **30 days** of receipt of each invoice.

6. TERM AND TERMINATION



This Agreement shall become effective upon execution by both parties and shall continue until terminated by either party with **30 days' written notice**. All inspection services rendered prior to termination shall be paid for in accordance with the terms set forth herein.

7. INDEMNIFICATION

Each party shall be responsible for its own acts and omissions and the acts and omissions of its employees, officers, and agents. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as a waiver of governmental immunity under the laws of the State of Utah.

8. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

Current Policy

CONTINUING EDUCATION

- Employees are encouraged to obtain continuing education through attendance at job related seminars. Requests for attendance must be approved in advance by the Mayor or designee.
 - a. Required by the City of Blanding. When the City of Blanding requires an employee to attend any education or training course, conference, seminar, or certification course, the City of Blanding will provide the necessary time off with pay and will reimburse the employee for all associated costs including tuition or registration fees, authorized travel, meals, and lodging.
 - b. Encouraged by the City of Blanding. Employees are encouraged to further their education and training in areas that will enhance their job performance. Upon advance approval by the Mayor or designee, and upon successful completion of relevant training courses, employees shall be reimbursed for tuition fees, materials, and other necessary and approved expenses upon presentation of proper receipts. Proof of successful completion will include one of the following:
 - i. A certificate indicating successful course completion, if applicable.
 - ii. A grade point average of 2.0 or higher on a 4.0 (A, B, C, D) scale.
 - iii. A grade of pass on a pass/fail grading system.

We are recommending the following be added

2. Service Commitment Requirement for City-Funded Certifications and Education

a. When the City of Blanding covers the cost of certifications, licenses, or education programs that are requested by the employee and approved by the Mayor or their designee, the employee agrees to the following:

3. Work Commitment

- a. Employees who receive City funding for education, certifications, or training programs not required for their current position shall commit to a two (2) year employment period with Blanding City, beginning from the date of completion of the course or certification.
- b. The total cost of the City-funded education will be divided by 24 months to determine a monthly prorated repayment amount. If the employee voluntarily resigns or is terminated for cause before completing the two-year commitment, they shall be required to repay the City the remaining balance of the prorated amount based on the number of months not completed.
- c. There will be a maximum cap of \$10,000 for education or certification expenses only if approved in advance by the Mayor and Blanding City Council. Any amount exceeding \$10,000 must receive formal approval from the Blanding City Council prior to payment.
- d. This requirement is based on the date the certification or course is successfully completed, not the date of payment.

4. Repayment Obligation

- a. If an employee voluntarily terminates employment or is terminated for cause before completing the full two-year (24-month) work commitment following the completion of City-funded education, certification, or training, the employee will be required to repay the City on a prorated basis for the remaining commitment.
- Example: If Blanding City funds \$2,400 in training and the employee resigns 6
 months after completion, the employee will be responsible to repay 18/24 of the
 cost (i.e., \$1,800).
- c. Repayment must be made within 30 days of separation from employment unless a written payment plan is approved by the City Manager or Finance Department.

5. Exemptions

- a. This service commitment and repayment obligation does not apply to any training or continuing education that is specified above in section 1a:
- b. However, if the training exceeds the minimum requirement (i.e., is above and beyond what is necessary for the role), the repayment provision will apply.

6. **Documentation and Agreement**

 Employees must sign an Education Assistance Agreement acknowledging the total cost covered by the City, the required commitment period, and repayment terms.
